JIM "DOODLE" MUNN

I was born in Indiantown, South Carolina (sometime in the 1930s) and later moved to the "Jitterbug Capitol of the World" Florence, S.C.!

Our first home in Florence was on Pine Street where my first real friendships were molded . . . with people such as "Pee Wee", "Hoot", and Barnes Howle, and "B.O." Graham. I took my first drink ("PJ") at the Darlington 500 with Buddy Kennedy, George Guffin, Craig Blackman, Bobby Browning, and Jimmy Calcutt.

In 1950 I entered the University of South Carolina and joined the Pi Kappa Phi Fraternity . . . also known as "22 Jitterbugs and a Jew" (I always thought Lanny Shay was a Greek!). Included in the "22" were Harry Driver, Clayton McManaway, Buddy Kennedy, Bill Pitman, "Wormy" Wall, Sam Shipp, Wesley Kennedy, Charles McLendon, Hank Fulmer, Bert Bennett, "Booger" Garrick, Lamar Johnson, "Bubba" Brunson, and Hopp Hopkins. In addition to my "22" antics, I was a Carolina cheerleader. "Go Cocks!"
